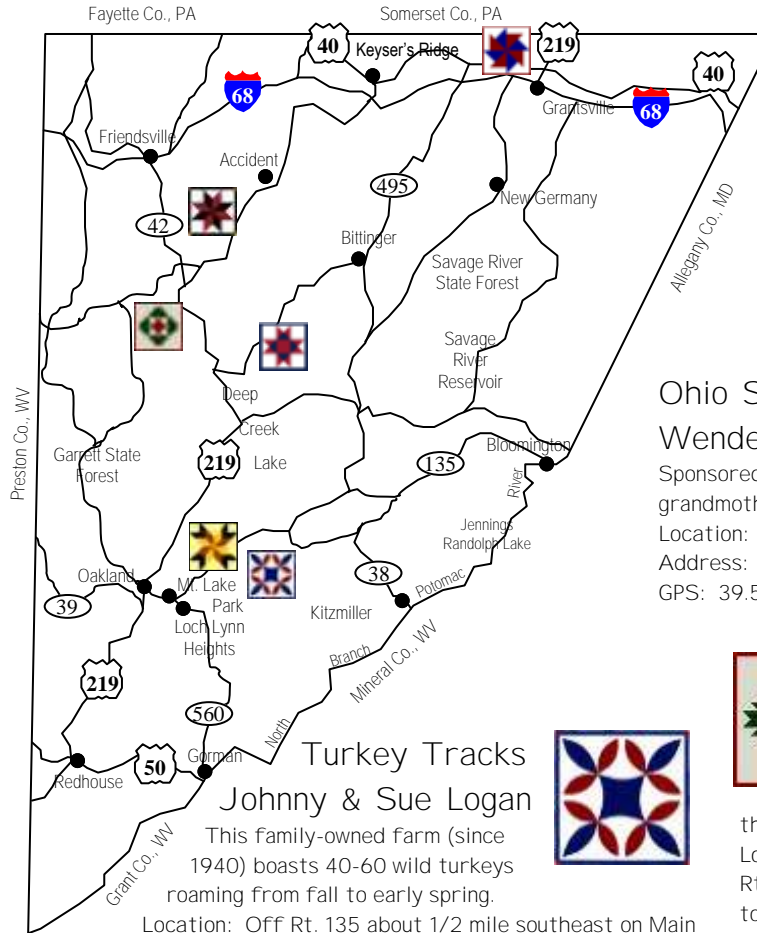

This block is a tribute to Greg's
mother. Bill Slagle designed and built the barn in 1962.
Location: About 2 miles west on Sang Run Road, off Rt. 219 in McHenry. From Friendsville, take Rt. 42 to Bishoff or Hoyes Sang Run Road to Sang Run Road. You will approach the barn from behind.
Address: 5440 Sang Run Road, McHenry, MD 21541 (for GPS, this is the house. The barn is before you go around the corner.)

Turkey Tracks

This family-owned farm (since 1940) boasts 40-60 wild turkeys roaming from fall to early spring.

Location: Off Rt. 135 about 1/2 mile southeast on Main Street just outside the town of Deer Park. Look to the right shortly after you cross the railroad tracks.

Double Pinwheel

This farmstead along National Pike was settled by Irish immigrants in the 1700's
Location: On the corner of Posey Row Road and Rt. 40 (National Pike), just west of Grantsville. It is right across the road from an Amish produce stand.
